2022 IN REVIEW

2022 brought a lot of changes to McKenzie's Hope! We had a full year of having a full time Family Advocate, we were awarded a Lowe's Hometown Grant that has helped to allow our expansion, successfully went through National Children's Alliance reaccreditation, and had a very successful 9th annual Night of Hope!

At the end of 2021, McKenzie's Hope was able to offer a full time position to our Family Advocate, Jess Jones. To say there has been a difference in our advocacy services would be an understatement, in the best way.

In June, we found out that we were awarded a Lowe's Hometown Grant in the amount of \$75,000 for our expansion of McKenzie's Hope! This grant helped to fund the construction and material costs of this project. In October, McKenzie's Hope hosted a Red Vest Volunteer day for roughly 25 Lowe's Associates, who came and volunteered their time to paint at the CAC.

In August, McKenzie's Hope went through the Nation Children's Alliance reaccreditation process, with having a site visit on August 10th. All of our disciplines and board members came together to make this a successful process, which we found out in late October that we passed, with flying colors!

October brought our 9th annual Night of Hope, which raised a record \$41,000 for McKenzie's Hope! Jen Clark was our speaker and Barrabba's BBQ served food! The community turnout of support was amazing!

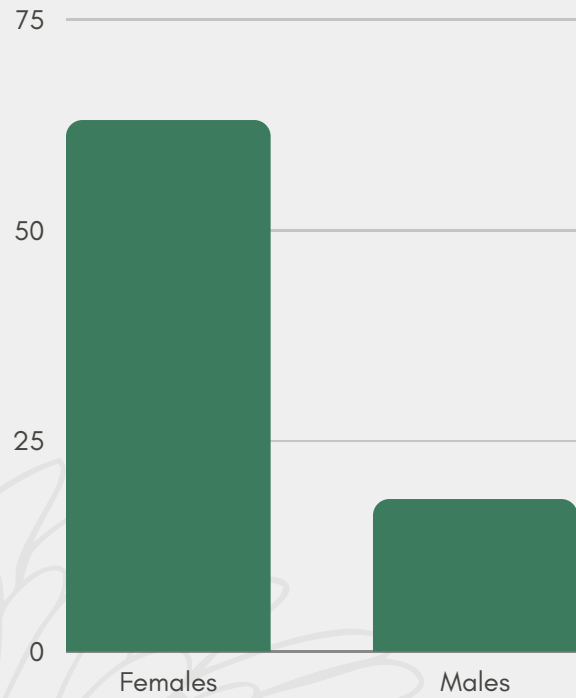
We did all of this while still providing best practice services to 81 children of Huntington and surrounding counties.

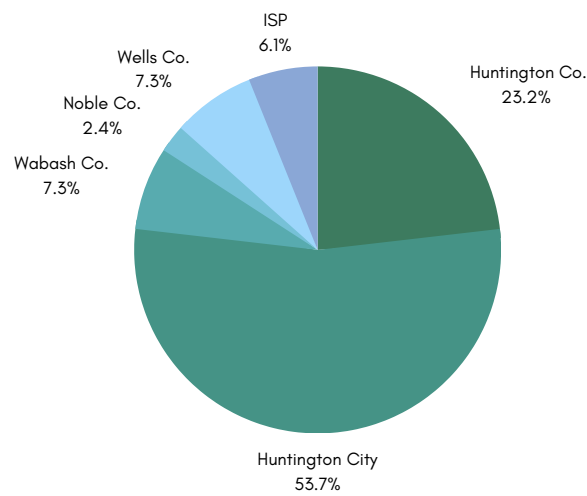

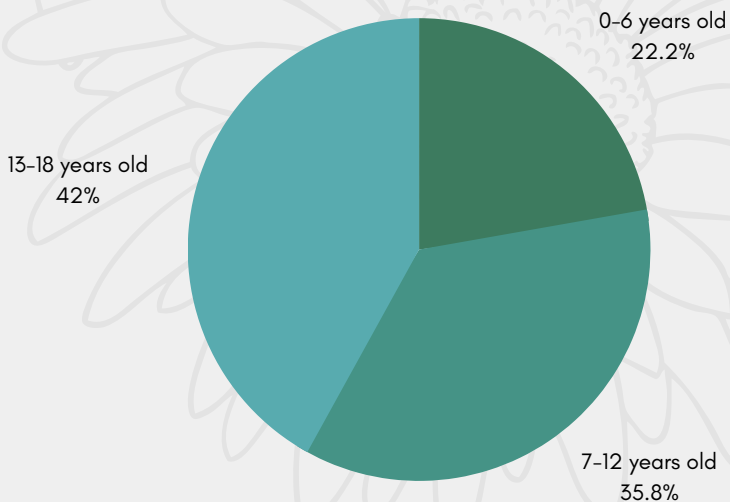
Clients by Gender
